## Pr. Chad Langdon at Christ-Wichita Ties with Haiti, Tomah Shinga and more!

Christ-Wichita is welcoming Pastor Chad Langdon, installed on October 9. He previously served as Associate Pastor at Hope Lutheran Church, St. Charles, MO.

Pr. Langdon graduated from University of Missouri and Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary in South Carolina. He looks forward to working with youth and young families, and is impressed with Christ-Wichita's Falcon Fellowship with Heights High students. He enjoys contemporary worship services as well as more traditional, and has expertise with worship service projection. He has interest in community ministry especially with people who are homeless. Pr. Landon has strong ties to Camp Tomah Shinga, where he was a camp counselor for 6 summers.

Pr. Landon is married to Lynde. Their daughter Vivine was adopted from Haiti in 2009 (before the earthquake, which affected the orphanage and staff families). Vivine is 6, attending Gammon School first grade.

The Landons maintain a close relationship with people in Port au Prince, Haiti, and the House of Hope orphanage for girls. Lynde is an adoption coordinator with the orphanage and families. The family makes semi-annual trips to serve at the orphanage in various ways, with their next trip coming up the first week of December. This will be a "Christmas trip," with gifts for the girls and a week of activities similar to VBS. Lynde is also a writer for *World* magazine.

### **Nobel Peace Prize to Lutheran African Activist**

Leymah Roberta Gbowee, a Lutheran Liberian peace activist, has been awarded the Nobel Peace Prize. The announcement came Oct. 7 from Oslo, Norway.

Gbowee, a member of the Lutheran Church in Liberia, is responsible for organizing a non-violent women's movement that brought an end to the 14-year civil war in Liberia. She spoke inspirationally at the churchwide convention of the Women of the ELCA this summer. Her story is told in the documentary "Pray the Devil Back to Hell."
